Social Inclusion in Commune Investment Program (CIP)

The Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) has reformed local administration by transferring power and decision-making to the sub-national level - decentralization. Remarkably, the Commune/Sangkat administration has been given the ability to take autonomous decisions on Commune/Sangkat program planning, including Commune/Sangkat development and investment programs.

The guidelines on program planning requires increased citizen participation, especially women, youth, people with disabilities (PWDs), elders, Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs), private companies, and others. The purpose of this requirement is to ensure local people's representatives are included in the local government's decision-making process. Social inclusion in CIP is essential as it ensures that people's voices from various backgrounds, including the vulnerable groups, are heard and reflected in critical local development.

About the Event

With the support from the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) through The Asia Foundation's Ponlok Chomnes: Data and Dialogues for Development in Cambodia program, the Affiliated Network for Social Accountability (ANSA) conducted a study entitled "Social Inclusion in Local Planning Process." The objectives of the study are to identify critical socioeconomic and policy trends around social inclusion at the local level, assess the actual practice of social inclusion within the current local planning process, and suggest key areas for consideration, for instance, the use of social media to promote social inclusion. The study was conducted between February and December 2020 in three provinces in Cambodia, namely Rattanakiri, Siem Reap, and Takeo.

The Foundation and ANSA Cambodia are co-organizing a virtual Policy Talk on "Social Inclusion in Commune Investment Program (CIP) and Emerging Opportunities for New Social Media Uses" to disseminate key findings from the study. Drawing on insights from policymakers, researchers, practitioners, and ANSA's research findings, this panel will address several themes below:

- Key policies on social inclusion in local planning: What are the critical policies around social inclusion at Commune/Sangkat Investment Program (CIP) in Cambodia?
- The actual practices of social inclusion in CIP in Cambodia: Are the voices of women, youth, elders, minority groups, people with disabilities, and other vulnerable groups included in the CIP process? Are there any challenges in the implementation? What are the effects of COVID-19 on social inclusion in CIP?

- Recommendations to promote social inclusion in CIP: What are the suggested areas for consideration to promote social inclusion in CIP? Is the use of social media feasible for the promotion of social inclusion?

Taken together, the panel seeks to contribute to our understanding and the promotion of social inclusion in CIP in Cambodia.
